The Litterboom Project, with a six year history in large scale coastal cleanups and river cleanups around the country believe that this doesn't have to be our future.

THE BACK A BEACH MODEL




- Our model consists of defining stretches of coastline and allocating permanent teams to managing the waste that collects along the coast. Each team will also be responsible for sorting any recyclable materials in order to reduce the plastic that goes to landfill.
- We will conduct weekly bag collections at each of these working stretches.
- Teams will be in identifiable uniforms and will go through basic waste management training, as well as have all the necessary personal protection equipment.
- Each team will be responsible for a stretch no longer than 3kms (depending on volumes of waste).

BACK A BEACH SUPPORTS CHANGE

At TLP we don't only believe in cleaning up the seemingly endless amounts of plastic from our beaches and rivers, but we believe in an eco-system approach, whereby intentionally forming mitigation strategies upstream as well.

Support towards this programme will also work synergistically towards our other programmes, which are our;

Litterboom Programme: Whereby our dedicated River Wardens work full time to ensure they are intercepting plastic pollution closer towards the areas that they are leaking into the environment.

Reclaimer Programme: Mobilising and implementing reclaimers/waste pickers within strategic communities that are incentive driven, to allow them the opportunity to generate an income from collecting recyclables- whereby preventing this waste from reaching the rivers.

Wastepreneur Programme: In 2022 we created the Wastepreneur Programme for the purpose off stimulating demand around repurposed plastic from the environment as a plastic pollution mitigation strategy. We have successfully created working opportunities for both of the original candidates and are working with local companies to expand these product ranges, so that all graduates of the programme have access to entrepreneurial opportunities in an emerging eco-product market.

Education: We are passionate about education and teaching people about the problems around plastic, what we are doing to address these challenges and how they can play their part. We will be launching our educational programme this year and we are excited to share more about this and how schools and educators can get involved!




PRICING
